Example: Women are good at telling white lies, but men are good at telling big lies.

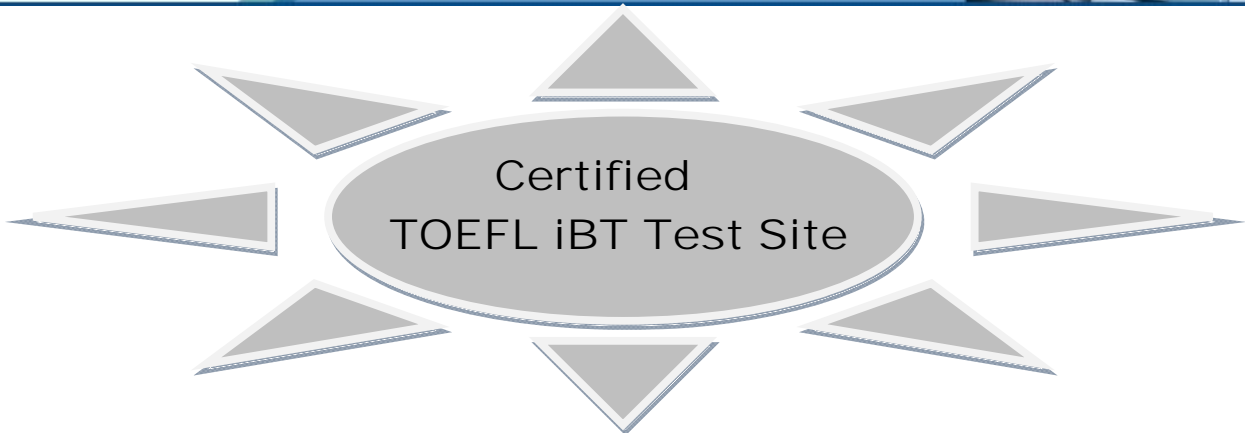
