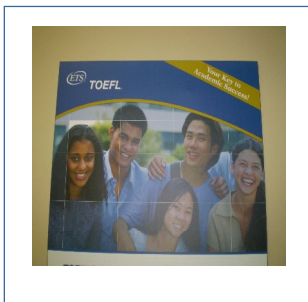

Example: This glass is chipped.

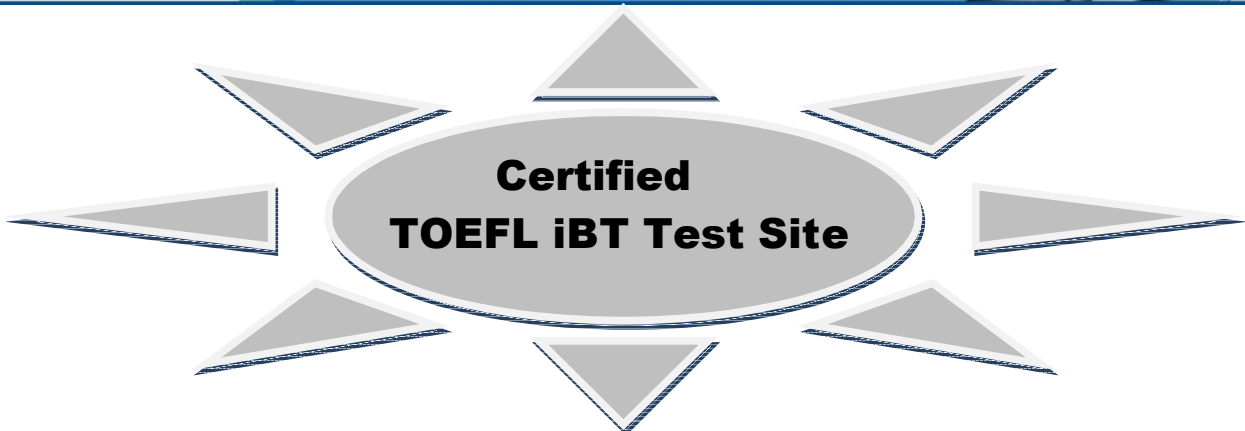
